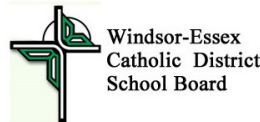
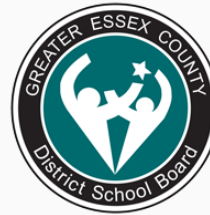


Why Should I Join?

PAID CO-OP: \$52.35/half day, \$104.70 full day

- Graduates who remain in the Naval Reserve will be provided with part-time and possibly full-time employment opportunities
- Tuition support program available for post secondary students in the Naval Reserve (up to \$2000/year for up to four years)
- A flexible career that works for you
- Reservists have emergency medical coverage during all employment and are entitled 90% Dental coverage after Basic Training
- The Naval Reserve will give your resume an edge with development of leadership skills, physical fitness, professionalism, communication skills and how to work as part of a team

What is a Naval Reserve CO-OP?

Windsor's Naval Reserve CO-OP program allows students the opportunity to enrol in the Naval Reserve earn and High School credits for completing Basic Training. The Naval Reserve is the component of the Royal Canadian Navy that offers exciting part-time or even full-time career opportunities from coast to coast.

This program emphasizes responsible citizenship and gives you the opportunity to develop and expand leadership skills, as well as gain unique life experiences.

Earn a total of **4 credits** during semester 2 and summer! Completing the Coop Program will earn a student approximately **\$7000!**

February - June: 1 Credit

Earned Tuesday and Thursday Nights for 3hrs

July - August: 3 Credits

Full Time employment during the Summer

Who Can Join?

- You must be a Canadian Citizen
- You must have 15 credits
- You must be at least 16 years of age prior to October 31st
- If under 18 you must have parental and/or guardian consent

What will I Learn?

- Introduction to the Canadian Armed Forces and the Royal Canadian Navy
- First Aid/CPR/AED Certification
- Weapons Handling and Safety
- Canadian Armed Forces Drill
- General Workplace Administration
- Physical Fitness and Sports
- Leadership and Public Speaking Skills

How do I apply?

1. Notify your Guidance Counsellor or CO-OP teacher of your interest and pick up an application package. The package will have detailed instructions on how to complete the initial online application and how to complete the required paperwork that follows
2. Complete your online application by following the steps in CO-OP application package
3. Return all signed consent forms to your Guidance Counsellor or CO-OP teacher
4. A recruiter will send you electronic forms via email that you will complete and send back prior to your Fitness Evaluation

Note: Reservists are not required to serve a specific term and can release voluntarily at any time, even if they receive tuition support.
